## Infections: Antibiotic prophylaxis / medication: Hysterosalpingogram for infertility

This document should be read in conjunction with this Disclaimer

On the morning of the procedure commence:

- 50mg diclofenac every 8 hours (take with or soon after food). Maximum duration of 3-5 days.
- If dilated tubes or history of PID:
  - Doxycycline 100mg every 12 hours for 5 days
  - Metronidazole 400mg stat
