GLIBENCLAMIDE

Presentation	Tablet: 5mg
Dose	<u>Type 2 diabetes</u> Oral: 2.5–20 mg daily in 1 or 2 doses (up to 10 mg as single dose). Maximum daily dose 15 mg if 12–18 years.
Administration	<u>Oral</u> With or soon after food
Pregnancy	1st Trimester: Monitoring required 2nd Trimester: Monitoring required 3rd Trimester: Monitoring required
Breastfeeding	From the limited information available, glibenclamide has not been detected in breast milk and hypoglycaemia has not been observed in breastfed infants of women taking glibenclamide. Women who choose to breastfed their healthy full term infant while taking glibenclamide should observe the infant for signs of hypoglycaemia.
